

CopyWrite RSS Capabilities:

- **Frontpage RSS** – The frontpage of every CopyWrite website automatically generates an RSS feed containing each of the elements on the frontpage. This can be useful if your homepage is typically used as a news or blog page.

File Location: /rss/frontpage.xml

- **Site-wide Articles RSS** – There is an option under the article preferences panel in CopyWrite titled: “Publish to External RSS” (located in the RSS Feeds panel). If this drop-down is changed to “Yes”, then that specific article will be included in a site-wide RSS feed including all other articles/pages are selected to “Yes”.

File Location: /rss/articles.xml

- **Summary RSS** – When creating a “Summary” page in CopyWrite, you have the option to generate an RSS feed containing all children articles/pages under this Summary Page. The option is under the article preferences panel in CopyWrite titled: “Generate RSS”. Changing the drop-down to “Yes” will generate the RSS feed. (Note: This option is only available for the Summary Page type).

File Location: /rss/<title of summary page>.xml

- **Article RSS** – There is an option under the articles preferences panel in CopyWrite titled: “Publish to Internal RSS” (located in the RSS Feeds panel). If this drop-down is changed to “Yes”, then a unique RSS feed will be created containing only this article/page. This would be useful for including the content of this page on another section of your website, or another website. (Note: Due to limitations of RSS, the description (the content of your article) may be cut off. It’s not recommended to use this method as a means of duplicating this article in its entirety on another website.)

File Location: /rss/<title of article page>.xml

- **Frontpage Element RSS** – When creating or modifying a frontpage element, you have the ability to select the type “RSS Feed”. This allows you to include any published RSS feed from the web in this element. This could be useful for displaying news, sports scores, etc. from 3rd party websites. You have full control over how many “elements” to display, as well as the description length and linking capabilities.

- **Article Element RSS** – You also have the ability to include an RSS feed on any article or summary page. This is done by adding a function call to the template:

```
<?php $contentdisplay->displayRSS('3', '100', 'Y', http://www.domain.com/example\_rss.xml); ?>
```

You have the ability to set 4 options for this function call (as shown above):
(‘number of elements to display’, ‘number of characters of the description to display’, ‘link the titles’, ‘url to RSS feed’)

You should place this function call inside of the template where you’d like the RSS feed to be displayed.
